Michigan Eye-Bank's Eye Donor Month calendar spotlights local residents

ANN ARBOR – Residents from all over Michigan are showing their support for eye, organ and tissue donation in honor of National Eye Donor Month this March.

The Michigan Eye-Bank has created a March calendar featuring the photos of more than 30 Michigan residents who made their desire to be a donor known by signing up on the Michigan Organ Donor Registry. The calendar also offers facts and action items regarding donation and eye health.

"The action items are easy things people can do to support our mission during Eye Donor Month," explains Lisa Langley, Administrative Director of the Michigan Eye-Bank. "Inviting a family member to join the Donor Registry, for example, takes very little time, but has the potential to save lives and eyesight."

The poster-sized Eye Donor Month calendar will be displayed at community gathering places, such as libraries and town halls, as well as local businesses, hospitals and schools. It is also viewable on the Michigan Eye-Bank Web site, www.michiganeyebank.org.
